## Instructions for storing and transportation of human breast milk

- Wash your hands carefully before pumping or touching breast milk.
- Pumping breast milk can be done by hand or electric pump.
- If you use pump make sure it is clean and sterilized.
- Storing and transferring breast milk to NICU only in special breast milk bags, with ice pack.
- Always, on the breast milk bags write the neonates name, the date and the time of pumping.
- To avoid transmission of infection to NICU, breast milk that is not transferred or stored according to the directions of the NICU will be rejected.

Human milk storage guidelines			
Storage locations and temperatures			
Type of breast milk	Countertop 77°F (25°C) or colder (room temperature)	Refrigerator 40°F (4°C)	Freezer 0°F (-18°C) or colder
Freshly expressed or pumped	Up to <b>4 Hours</b>	Up to <b>4 Days</b>	Within 6 months is best Up to 12 months is acceptable
Thawed, previously frozen	1-2 Hours	Up to <b>1 Day</b> (24 hours)	Never refreeze human milk after it has been thawed
Leftover from a feeding (baby did not finish the bottle)	Use within <b>2 hours</b> after the baby is finished feeding		

These guidelines are for healthy full-term babies and may vary for premature or sick babies.
